### Chania Meetings 2010

Many of the most important events of the EAAE take place in Chania (Crete, Greece) in early September each year.

This year the EAAE Council met on the first Saturday of September (4th). This was their final meeting before the General Assembly. Much was discussed but in particular sincere thanks and gratitude was offered to three council members who had completed their term with the Council; Hilde Heynen from Belgium, Loughlin Kealy from Ireland and Ramon Sastre from Spain. Two new council members were welcomed: David Vanderburgh from Belgium and Johannes Käferstein from Switzerland.



From the 4th to the 7th of September, the ENHSA 13th Meeting of Heads of Schools of Architecture was held at the Centre for Mediterranean Architecture. The subject discussed was "New priorities of Schools of Architecture in the era of uncertainty." In the afternoon of Monday, 6th of September, the EAAE General

Assembly took place in the framework of the above mentioned ENHSA meeting. This was a very important event, since this year there was a change in the EAAE presidency.

Our French colleague Francis Nordemann's term of two years was over and he was replaced by Stefano Musso from Italy. The speeches of both presidents ([incoming](#) and outgoing in [English](#) and [French](#)) were very touching and showed the commitment of those who front the EAAE. At the same session, Máire Henry from Ireland, a Council member, was appointed new Treasurer of the EAAE.

Finally, this year there was an extra event. From the 1st to the 3rd of September the 5th EAAE-ENHSA Architectural Theory Subgroup Workshop was held at the Department of Architecture, Technical University of Crete. The subject of the event was SUR-FÂCE - ΕΠΙΦΑΝΕΙΑ, Digital Materiality and the New Relation between Depth and Surface.
