18:15h - 20:00h **session 01: The Charter on Architectural Education, from position paper to policy paper**

In this session we will present the draft version of the charter in its actual state, explain the process, discuss the status, as well as content and approach.

Saturday 16 June - 9:00-18:00

09:00h – 12:30h **session 02: Educating the educators**

Architectural (design) education is typically taught by intuition, precedence and habit. The workshops have demonstrated that there is an urgent need for a more systematic training of the teachers, and the development of a proper scholarship of teaching and learning, as well as a critical reflection on the existing models/established practices.

In this session we will fathom the nature of architectural education, and brainstorm about possible approaches and actions that can be undertaken to improve the quality of teaching, training, and education.

14:00h – 18:00h **session 03: the quality of architectural education**

Architectural education operates in a straddle between generic national and European Qualifications Frameworks, and European and national professional directives and regulations. Several accreditation standards coexist next to each other. However, compliancy with these frameworks is felt as an administrative burden, and adhered for strategic reasons, rather than to secure and improve the actual quality of architectural education.

What is the actual value of architectural education, and how can this value be secured? What are appropriate principles, approaches and criteria for evaluating quality of architectural education? How to foster richness, diversity, experimentation in a context of increasing measurement and proof of accountability? How do we define quality (with the criteria we think are important for architectural education)? How do we establish a common culture of quality assurance? Could this be a new model or an alternative to the top-down instruments of the higher education politics and instances?

In this session we will discuss the above questions, set out a strategy to tackle them, identify the actors that should be involved, and design a series of upcoming workshops and meetings.
