6.3 Conservation Network (Stefano Musso)

The network is an open framework that supports academic relationships based on opportunity for debate about “cultural exchange”. The workshops create opportunities for academics and practitioners, not only in conservation, who are engaged in architectural education, to discuss the theoretical and practical/technical issues encountered in conservation of the architectural inheritance of buildings, towns and created landscapes. Participants recognise the incompleteness of their knowledge and the partiality of their experience and they can challenge their preconceptions, and their approach to their work; participants comprises teachers, researchers, practitioners and doctoral students, not only of conservation.



The aim of each event, and of the subsequent publication process is to:

- Deepen understanding of the changing field of conservation within the contemporary architectural culture;
- provide an opportunity to connect with colleagues in academia and practice through collaborative investigations and discussions;
- provide an outlet for the results of the work and reflection; improve teaching and research practice.

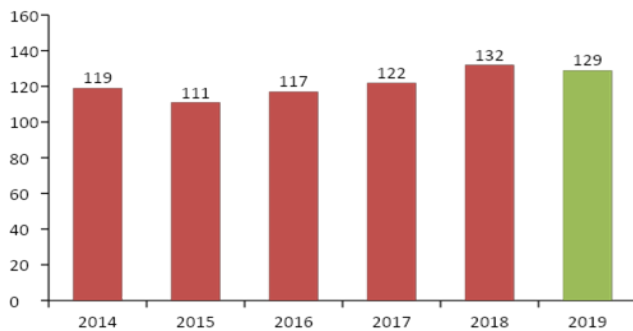
Decision: The annual accounts 2018 and the Auditor's Report 2018 are voted and approved by the GA. The report of the accountant can be found on the EAAE website.

9.3 Information and Discussion on membership fees as of 2020

This agenda item was prepared and presented by the respective workgroup (Vice-President Ilaria Valente, Harriet Harriss, Sally Stewart. Hugo Dworzak was in the workgroup).

As it had been decided in the General Assembly 2018, in Porto, the Council prepared a new economy proposal for the GA 2019. The EAAE member schools were informed beforehand about the Council's main arguments to raise the membership fees as of 2020 via a letter sent to them together with the invitation to the General Assembly 2019. With the current income, EAAE is only able to cover the regular costs of its essential daily business, but not able to support many activities and services which have been initiated and are in the planning.

The Council therefore proposes to the GA to raise the annual membership fee

- from 500€ to 650 € for full school members,
- from 150 € to 500 € associated institutional members,
- from 100 € to 200 € for associated individual members.

fixed for three years, to be re-evaluated at the end of each elective period.

Decision: The proposal is voted and approved unanimously by the GA, the membership fees will be raised as of 2020.
